



INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICATION FOR DOUBLE DEGREE STUDENTS

1. REQUESTING A USERNAME AND PIN (LOGIN CREDENTIALS)

Apply online through this website <https://www.upv.es/entidades/sint/en/incoming-students/>

First, you will have to create a new profile: "Request a user ID and password". In "Type of activity" select "Student exchange program" and then select your School/Faculty of admission at UPV, in this case, "Camins - E.T.S.I CAMINOS, CANALES Y PUERTOS" (School of Civil Engineering - ETSICCP)

Make sure that you write a correct email address that you check frequently. Your request has to be seen and processed by a member of staff, so do not expect to receive your login credentials immediately (it may take a few working days). **UPV staff can only approve a request for login credentials if we have previously received a valid nomination from your home university, confirming that you have been selected for a mobility period at UPV (double degree in the field of civil engineering).**

If everything is correct, you will receive two automatic emails:

- An email with instructions to complete a full online application
- An email including your login credentials. Save them as you will continue to use them during your stay at UPV.

If you do not receive the email with the login details within 7 days after your request (check your spam folder), please contact us at int_etsiccp@upvnet.upv.es.

2. ONLINE APPLICATION ON OUR APPLICATION PORTAL (AIRE)

When you receive your login details:

STEP 1

- Go back to <https://www.upv.es/entidades/sint/en/incoming-students/> or use the direct link <https://aplicat.upv.es/aire-app/>. Complete all fields of the electronic form.
- Include a pre-selection of classes to take at UPV (section "Academic data"). You will be allowed to make changes during your stay if necessary. **Before choosing your classes, read attentively the information in sections 6 and 7 of this document.**

STEP 2

Once you have completed all sections, **confirm your application online** like this:

- in section "Status of application", use the drop-down menu and select "Application confirmed online", then click on the orange button next to it to save it.
- When you have done this, the status of your application will change to "Confirmed" and a new orange button will appear on the screen: **Print application**. Click on this button and the system will open a new window with a PDF file including all your details on one page.

STEP 3

Finally, you must upload the following documents to your online application:

- **Printed application**, signed by you and your university. This is the document you obtain in Step 2. Please attach a recent picture (passport-style) in the upper right corner.
- **Letter of presentation/motivation**: freestyle, maximum 1 page in English or in Spanish.



- **Recent academic transcript (in English or Spanish):** your academic results **since your first year of university education**. If you are a master's student, include also a transcript for your bachelor level studies. If the document issued by your home university does not include the courses you are enrolled in during this semester, create a Word document yourself. Merge all documents (Bachelor + Master + courses enrolled this semester) into one single PDF file.
- **Certificate(s) of language skills** (see section below "4. Language requirements").

DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION (ALL DOCUMENTS MUST BE UPLOADED BY THIS DATE) (*)

- **WINTER / FALL SEMESTER or FULL ACADEMIC YEAR: 15 May**
- **SPRING SEMESTER: 15 October**

(*) You must start your online application online at least one week before the deadline for two reasons: 1) have to allow you into the system by giving you login credentials and 2) your university has to sign a document at the end of the process before you upload it.

3. LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS - CERTIFICATES ACCEPTED

All Double degree students applying for admission to our School of Civil Engineering must submit proof of having achieved **level B1 of Spanish for admission**.

The only exceptions are:

- a. Spanish native speakers
- b. Italian or Portuguese native speakers: it is not obligatory to upload an official language Spanish certificate, but these students must upload Annex I (self-certification), available at the end of these instructions and also [in this link](#).

We accept the following certificates

- [DELE B1](#), [UniCert](#) Stufe 1, [SIELE Global](#) (in person or remote version), [TELC](#) B1,
- Annex II (last page of these instructions), also available [in this link](#).

We do not accept the following documents

- Erasmus OLS test results
- Transcripts of records from secondary school. Please discuss your current level with your home university and ask them to sign [Annex II](#).
- Certificate of enrollment in a B1 Spanish course (being enrolled in a language course is not the same thing as having completed a level of CEFR in the 4 language skills).

5. STUDY PROGRAM AT UPV

As a Double Degree student, your study plan at UPV is pre-defined. As opposed to Erasmus students, you cannot pick and choose your classes freely. You must respect the requirements and curriculum established between UPV and your home university in order to obtain the UPV master's degree.

5.1 Students coming from EIVP Paris and ESTP Paris

You must complete the full 120 credits of the master's degree in Civil Engineering "*Máster en Ingeniería de Caminos, Canales y Puertos*" (2 full academic years).

This program has 2 different curricula or learning tracks at UPV

- 1) Curriculum for students coming from UPV Bachelor in Public Works Engineering, or "*Grado en Ingeniería de Obras Públicas- GIOP*"
- 2) Curriculum for students coming from the UPV Bachelor in Civil Engineering or "*Grado en Ingeniería Civil (GIC)*". This is the curriculum which will be applied to students from EIVP-*Ingénieur en Génie Urbain* and ESTP- Paris -*Ingénieur - Travaux Publics / Bâtiment*

First year at UPV: Primero (Obligatorio General) + Primero (Optativo General)

Second year at UPV: Segundo (Obligatorio General) + Segundo (Optativo general: 22,5 ECTS)

The Master's thesis / Degree project (TFM) is officially 12 ECTS (although the actual workload is closer to 20 ECTS). The degree project is different from a French *Travail de Fin d'Études*; it is not based on an internship. It is a professional Engineering Project which is prepared by students at the same time as they are following some classes in the second semester of Year 2. A degree project has a professional orientation: a real-life (or simulated) engineering project; research projects are only authorized if they include a practical case or application to a specific civil engineering project.

The Degree project cannot be delivered and presented until all the credits in the master's program have been completed. Should this happen, you will first have to re-take and pass the failed classes before presenting you Final project in Valencia.

Some students complete their Degree project it in July, some in September (this includes an oral presentation and defense). It is also possible to submit and defend the master thesis later one (there are monthly defense sessions during the academic year).

5.2 Students coming from Università degli studi di Trento

In your first two semesters at UPV, you will have to take 54 credits of a specific list of courses from the 1st year of the Master’s degree in Civil Engineering (*Máster universitario en Ingeniería de Caminos, Canales y Puertos*).

You will find the list in Annex I of this document (page 11). Additionally you will have to follow the UNITN course “140207 *Ingegneria Sismica e Progettazione Strutturale*” remotely.

In a 3rd semester you will have to complete your Master’s thesis / Final Project. You will have an academic supervisor from UPV and another one from UniTrento. If you have completed all the required credits at UPV, you may choose to prepare the master’s thesis in Valencia or from Italy. If you have to re-take a UPV course, it will only be possible to do it in Valencia, while you complete your last credits in Spain.

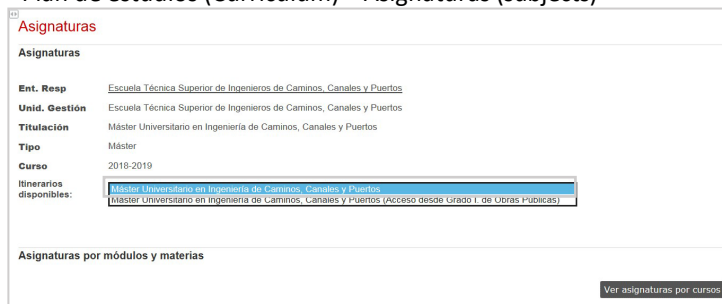
The thesis must be submitted (paper + online) and presented in front of a panel of lecturers in Valencia. It is only possible to do this when all the credits necessary for the Double Degree have been completed. A Uni Trento lecturer will be invited to be part of the commission of professors for the oral presentation (in person or via videoconference).

ANNEX I. SELF-CERTIFICATION OF SPANISH LANGUAGE LEVEL (only for Spanish, Italian, or Portuguese native speakers)

I confirm that Italian / Portuguese is my native language;

UPV will not require any formal Spanish certificate for admission

However, I have read, understood, and accepted the following points:

- **UPV expects Italian and Portuguese native speakers to enroll in courses (subjects) taught in Spanish, not in English** (preparation of Bachelor or Master's thesis can be carried out in English, as well). Enrollment in any course taught in English will only be exceptionally approved if there are no capacity problems in a certain course (more student requests than spots available).
- Courses (subjects) at UPV have a continuous assessment method, sometimes with exams or assignments due a few weeks after the beginning of the semester. **Italian and Portuguese native speakers are expected to be able to communicate in Spanish since their arrival (not perfect Spanish, but functional). Students must study basic Spanish grammar, pronunciation, and vocabulary before arrival.**
- The Spanish language courses for exchange students during the semester begin at level A2 (B1 in campus Alcoy). **Exchange students will be allowed to participate in these courses as long as they have consolidated the previous CEFR level before arrival** (there is a level exam shortly before the beginning of the classes).

ANNEX II. STATEMENT OF SPANISH LANGUAGE SKILLS (BY HOME UNIVERSITY)

Starting from the 2026–2027 academic year, UPV will no longer accept certificates signed by the home institution stating that the student commits to improving his/her Spanish before arriving at UPV, or certificates of ongoing (unfinished) Spanish courses.

No additional Spanish language certificates will be accepted after the application period closes (May 15, October 15). **The only exception is the Faculty of Fine Arts.**
